Heidelberg Catechism: 12 – 15

PASTOR: According to God’s righteous judgment we deserve punishment both in this world and forever after: how then can we escape this punishment and return to God’s favor?

ALL: God requires that his justice be satisfied. Therefore, the claims of his justice must be paid in full, either by ourselves or another.

PASTOR: Can we pay this debt ourselves?

ALL: Certainly not. Actually, we increase our guilt every day.

PASTOR: Can another creature – any at all – pay this debt for us?

ALL: No. To begin with, God will not punish another creature for what a human is guilty of. Besides, no mere creature can bear the weight of God’s eternal anger against sin and release others from it.

PASTOR: What kind of mediator and deliverer should we look for then?

ALL: One who is truly human and truly righteous, yet more powerful than all creatures, that is, one who is also true God.
