Silent Reflection and Prayer

"The true Christian is the only happy man because he can sit down quietly and think about his soul. He can look behind him... [think of how unhinged so many people are because of their past] He can think calmly about things to come [think of how many are undone by their worries about the future], and yet not be afraid. Sickness is painful; death is solemn; the Judgment Day is an awful thing: but having Christ for him, he has nothing to fear. He can think calmly about the Holy God, whose eyes are on all his ways, and feel 'He is my Father — I am weak, I am unprofitable; yet in Christ he regards me as His dear child, and is well pleased.' Oh, what a ... privilege it is to be able to think and not be afraid."

"It is the grace of the Gospel, which is so hard for the pious to understand, that it confronts us with the truth and says: You are a sinner, a great, desperate sinner; now come, as the sinner that you are, to God who loves you. He wants you as you are; He does not want anything from you, a sacrifice, a work; He wants you alone. 'My son, give me thine heart' (Prov. 23:26). God has come to you to save the sinner. Be glad! This message is liberation through truth. You can hide nothing from God. The mask you wear before men will do you no good before Him. He wants to see you as you are, He wants to be gracious to you. You do not have to go on lying to yourself and your brothers, as if you were without sin; you can dare to be a sinner. Thank God for that."
